DOCTOR SICKNESS CERTIFICATES

You can self-certify sickness from work via the government website for the first 7 days of an illness. If you need longer please phone Reception for advice.

SPECIAL REPORTS AND EXAMINATIONS

Pre-employment medicals and examinations for HGVs and public service vehicles are offered by the practice. Please discuss your needs with Reception, who will be able to help arrange this for you.

HELPING US

It is helpful if you can let us know if you are unable to attend your appointment, so we may offer the space to someone else.

OUT OF HOURS

After hours emergencies are managed and run by BOB Integrated Care Board. They operate a service from 6.30pm-8am Monday-Friday, and all day on weekends and bank holidays.

TEACHING

The practice is approved for the post-graduate training of experienced hospital doctors in General Practice. The GP specialist Trainee joins the practice for 1 year. The approval process involves the inspection of a small number of patients' medical records by health workers outside the practice. They treat the contents as strictly confidential. If you object to your records being looked at in this way, please inform us. We occasionally have Medical Students on short term placements from Oxford University, fully supervised by the doctors.

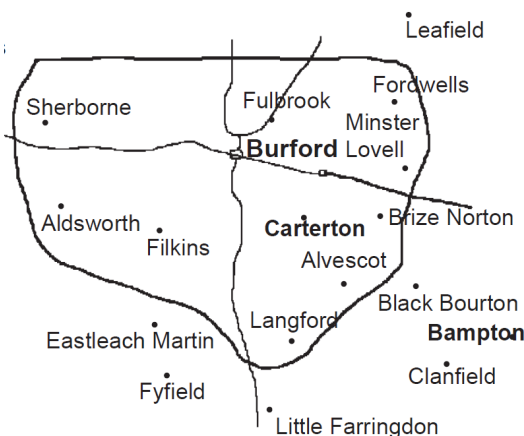
DONATIONS

Burford Surgery is the last building on the left at the end of Sheep Street. The premises were purpose-built in 1986 and offer easy access, good car parking facilities and a spacious waiting room. We operate a branch surgery at Carterton Health Centre. Access and toilet facilities are appropriate for the disabled.

Our Doctors work within a partnership. When you register you will be allocated a named GP ("usual doctor"). For continuity of care we encourage you to see your named GP each time you come to the surgery. There will be times, however, when they are not available to see you and when this happens we will offer you an appointment with another clinician. If you do not know who your named GP is please ask one of the Receptionists.

To Register with the surgery please request a registration pack from one of the Reception team. We suggest you make an appointment with your doctor or one of our Clinical Pharmacists if you are on regular medication, or if you have any worries. Your electronic records should arrive with us within a few days of registering, although paper notes can take up to a couple of months.

HOW TO USE THE SURGERY

OPENING HOURS:

Burford: Monday—Friday 08.00—18.30

Carterton: Monday—Friday 08.30—12.30

APPOINTMENTS—01993 822176 (option 1). Phone lines shut 1-2pm.

We offer routine appointments from 8.30am—6pm, both on the phone and in person, across both branches. Please call from 8am if you require an urgent on the day appointment. For routine queries and appointments please call after 10am.

For acute medical issues that require an on the day appointment you will be offered either a telephone call or a face to face appointment,. This could be with one of the GPs or with our Advanced Nurse Practitioner, Becca.

Our Receptionists are here to help signpost you to the most appropriate source of help.

URGENT MATTERS

An urgent problem is one that requires medical advice within 30 minutes. Please make this clear to the Receptionist when you speak to them. If they feel it is appropriate you may be directed to 999. Out of surgery hours please call 111 for advice, or 999 if you need immediate help.

HOME VISITS

If you think you need a home visit please ask the Receptionist to book a telephone appointment with your doctor. The GP will then make the arrangements with you. Please call in the morning if possible. Visits may be performed by EVS (The Early Visiting Service), which is a paramedic based service.

REPEAT PRESCRIPTIONS

Repeat prescriptions can be ordered online via your NHS app (please speak to Reception if you would like help setting this up), or by emailing our dispensary on: bobibc-ox.burfordurgery.dispensary@nhs.net. Please allow 48 hours.

DISPENSARY

If you live more than a mile from the chemist then we can provide your medicines for you directly and you can collect your treatment from the surgery.

DOCTORS

The Doctors will diagnose and then either treat your illness or refer you to a specialist. We offer both male and female doctors. We aim to promote continuity of care and a personal doctor service. Although you register with the practice, we encourage you to see the doctor of your choice.

ADVANCED NURSE PRACTITIONER

Our ANP offers on the day appointments for acute medical issues, as well as monitoring for some chronic diseases (asthma, diabetes etc).

PRACTICE NURSES

Our Practice Nurses carry out a number of services including blood tests, smears, immunisations, injections, dressings, asthma, diabetes and blood pressure checks, as well as NHS health checks. The Receptionist can help with booking the correct appointment.

MIDWIFE
